## DANIEL NICOLAAS PIENAAR



On 13 July 2009 Prof D N (Daan) Pienaar celebrated his 75th birthday.

With this volume *Journal for Semitics* honours Professor Daan Pienaar, a long-standing member of the Southern African Society for Near Eastern Studies. Professor Pienaar started his academic career at the University of the Free State in 1970. In 1974 he was awarded the degree DPhil in Semitic Languages from the University of Stellenbosch with the late Charles Fensham as promoter. Together they published *Geskiedenis van ou Israel* (1982). He lectured on a wide range of disciplines within the field of biblical studies. He is also well informed on archaeological excavations in Israel and during his career participated in excavations at Meiron (1974-1977), City of David (1978-1983) and Jezreel (1990). He regularly addressed church groups, academic societies and audiences with a general interest on archaeological topics, as well as on the understanding of the Bible and the biblical world. He received grants to study abroad and published articles in a number of accredited journals, as well as having many other publications to his name. Professor Pienaar has a zest for life and he continues to entertain a wide variety of interests, both academic and non-academic.
